#### **Social Climate**

#### Parent, Teacher and Student Satisfaction with the School \*2

Coolum Beach Christian College has a history of strong parent community engagement and support for the College. This has been significantly impacted due to COVID restrictions and this has continued to impact community events during 2022. Many college community events held in previous years in the College where not held in 2022. The College also announced the retirement of the Principal in Term 2 which was effective at the end of 2022. This anticipated change of leadership after the impact of the pandemic led to a college social climate being lower than in previous years. The board worked proactively to appoint a new Principal for 2023 and the successful candidate was announced at the start of term 3 2022, with the transition of Principal being planned for the start of 2023.
